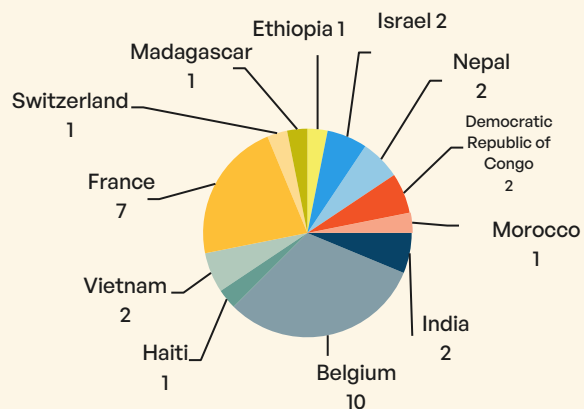

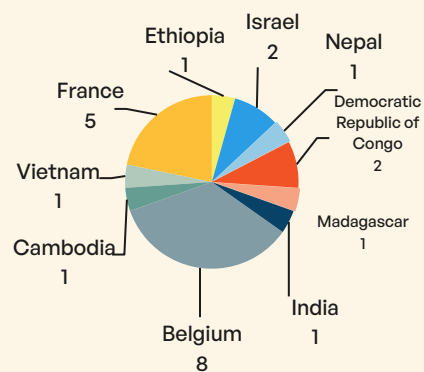

2022 – TOTAL 32 NGOS



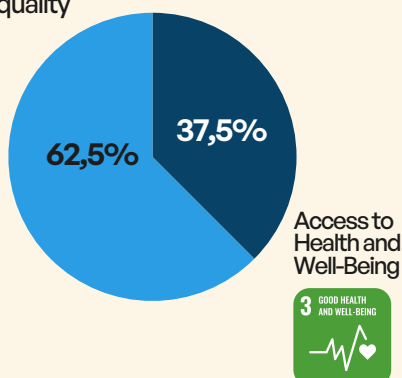
2021 – TOTAL 23 NGOS

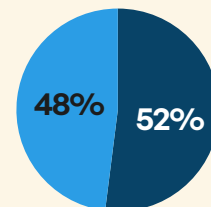

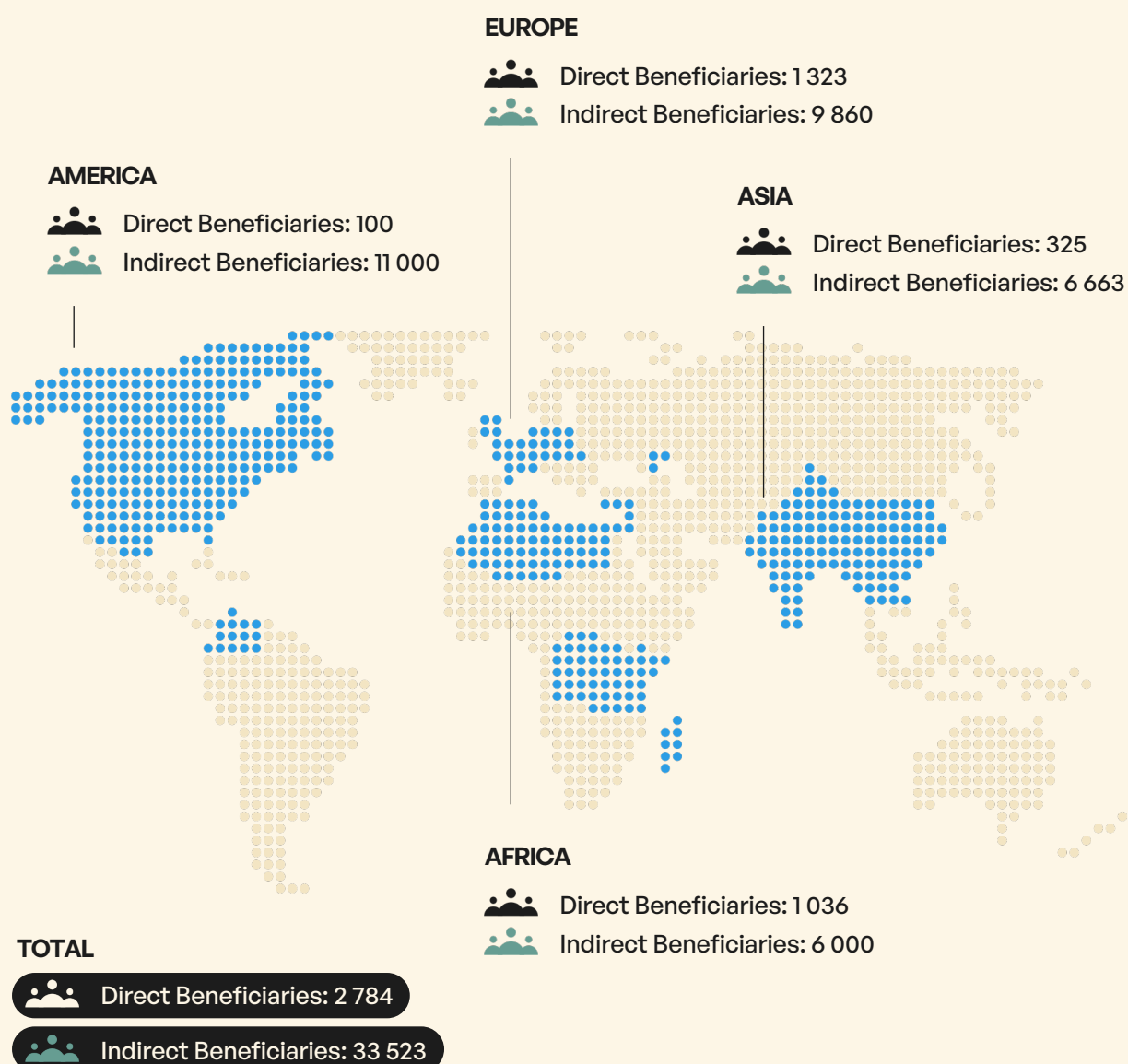

### 1. DIRECT BENEFICIARIES

#### Schooling-related activities

#### Impact calculation methodology

School registration fees (university, elementary school, kindergarten, etc.)

1 registration = 1 beneficiary

Scholarships

1 scholarship = 1 beneficiary

Extracurricular workshops (training modules, preparatory classes, etc.)

1 module = number of participants

#### Education-related activities

#### Impact calculation methodology

Support 50% of the construction of buildings and educational structures

1 construction = total number of students enrolled

Teachers' / lecturers' salaries

1 teacher = number of learners

Purchase of learning tools

1 tool = 1 beneficiary

Funding for medical research	Foundation MOVEMBER: 1250 projects.
